

## Uniform Regulations

- Year 6 – 10 students are to wear full summer or winter uniform to and from school.
- Year 1 – 5 students are to wear full tracksuit to school on PE lesson days.
- Blazers and boaters are to be worn to and from school each day including on buses travelling to or from the city, unless an announcement is made indicating otherwise.
- Secondary students involved in three or more College activities in one day, requiring the wearing of College Sports Uniform, may request a Uniform Exemption Card, giving them permission to wear their College Tracksuit to and from school.
- Secondary students in Term 2 and 3 may wear full College tracksuit to the College when the student has two periods (minimum) of sport-related lessons.
- College bike shorts/leggings are not to be worn to and from the College they are only to be worn in PE lessons.
- Students involved in after school training or sports competitions may wear full sports uniform home.
- A high standard of personal presentation is expected of students at all times and care should be taken to keep uniforms in good condition. If a uniform is soiled or damaged and requires repair or cleaning, **the complete reverse season uniform is to be worn, not the sports uniform, e.g. the summer uniform is to be worn if the winter uniform is being cleaned/repared.**
- All students must ensure their summer and winter uniforms are worn at knee length.
- According to the College Sun Protection Policy, in Term 1 and 4, a College sunhat or cap (not the College boater) is to be worn outside at recess, lunch breaks or while involved in other outdoor activities.
- Hair over collar length must be fully tied back with a regulation navy or white ribbon or head band. Any clips or combs used should be in neutral colours. Extreme hairstyles are unacceptable, including obviously dyed hair, hairstyles that incorporate two starkly contrasting shades such as bleached blond and dark brown, hair dyed black and hair bleached very blond. If a student's hair colour or style is unacceptable she will be required to alter it within a set period of time.
- A watch and small plain silver or gold sleepers or studs, including small pearls and clear diamante, may be worn (only one earring per lobe.) One clear plastic piercing retainer is permitted. No other facial piercings are permitted. Students will be asked to remove other jewellery and it will be held in the College Office, clearly labelled, to be returned at the end of term.
- Students are not to wear coloured nail polish or makeup with their school uniform. An excessive amount of fake tanning products is not permitted.
- During the two-year uniform transition period the navy College polar vest may be worn with the winter uniform in Term 2 and 3 whilst at College for extra warmth. This is not permitted to be worn to and from school.
- Where extra warmth is needed, navy school scarves may be worn with the winter uniform.

As a high standard of personal presentation is expected as outlined in the Uniform Requirements, Students that do not adhere to this expectation and do not wear their uniform appropriately etc will be issued with an infringement on the date this is observed and noted by a member of College staff.

Below is a table outlining the consequence of poor personal presentation.

### Uniform Infringements

Three uniform infringements per Term issued	Friday Lunch time detention	Parent/Carer notification via electronic letter
Six uniform infringements per Term issued	Friday after school detention	Parent/Carer meeting with relevant Director
Nine uniform infringement per Term issued	Saturday morning detention	Parent/Carer letter and meeting with relevant Director and Deputy Principal
