

- a. Develop more interdisciplinary approaches to curriculum and student learning to encourage deeper knowledge through active exploration of real-world challenges and issues.
- b. Make explicit the opportunities the College provides for each student to engage optimally with their learning and to set the bar for learning high.
- c. Continue to align the curriculum with Christian virtues and the principles of Catholic Social Teachings.
- d. Integrate and embed core tenets of Positive Education and restorative practices within learning programs to explicitly link the learning and wellbeing of the 'whole person'.
- e. Nurture respect, awareness and engagement in First Nations' cultures and issues.
- f. Develop Digital Citizenship skills that empower students to critically evaluate online content and self-regulate their use of digital technologies.

Courageous Learning

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Mount Carmel College commits to enhancing creativity and innovation in learning from Kindergarten to Year 10 through the following goals:

- 2. To maintain an exemplary standard of teacher professionalism and practice based on research-based pedagogy.
 - a. Design and implement powerful and innovative practices to foster creative and critical thinking to achieve lifelong learning outcomes.
 - b. Increase opportunities for inter-departmental Kinder to Year 10 professional learning activities.
 - c. To improve the capacity of all teachers to collect, analyse and use data to inform their teaching.
 - d. To develop the teachers' capacity to differentiate learning for all.
 - e. To create and embed professional learning communities for teachers to research and collaboratively share responsibility for improving student outcomes.
 - f. To provide ongoing opportunities to build cultural competence in Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander culture, knowledge and contemporary issues to facilitate a learning environment that celebrates, supports and acknowledges First Nation Heritage.
 - g. Deliver professional learning, support and resources to enhance the role of the teacher in the vertical Clan system.

- e. Build community connectedness to maximise our presence on a local, national and global platform.


Stewardship
